Our mission is considered a success when former Cadets, "Cadet Alumni", complete their Basic Initial Entry Training with the familiarity that allows them to focus on Leadership and Military Occupational Specialty (MOS) Skills vital to their growth of becoming competent productive leaders. Weekly meeting location is a Joint Forces Training Base, Los Alamitos, Sundays between 1400-1700 hrs.



Instruction of basic topics include (but not limited to):

New incoming personnel are issued combat uniforms and field equipment which then the individual is taught to maintain and care for in accordance to Army/Post Regulations. During certain training events, Cadets are periodically issued Inert Training Replica (ITR) weapons to enhance their experience of learning.
